

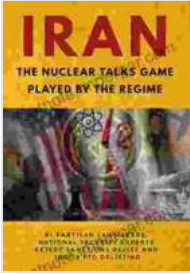
# **Bipartisan Lawmakers, National Security Experts Reject Sanctions Relief and Nuclear Deal with Iran**

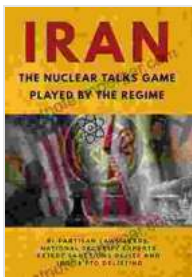
