


Tanks at the Iron Curtain 1946–60: Early Cold War armor in Central Europe (New Vanguard) by D C Robinson



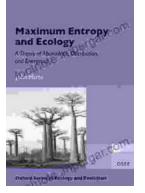
