5. **Rent gear.** If you only need a piece of gear for a short period of time, renting is a great option. It's also a good way to try out different gear before you buy it.

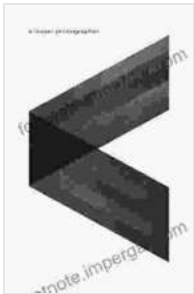

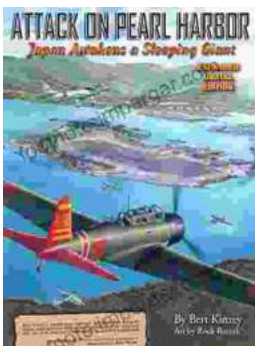
Remember, the most important thing is to create. Don't let the Gear Trap hold you back from your creative potential.



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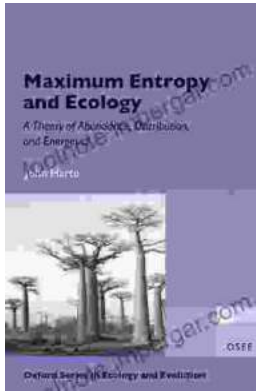
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
